Water With Blessings

Since 2009, Water With Blessings has brought more than 2,000 military-grade water filters to impoverished areas around the globe, specifically into the hands of mothers.

In the wake of the devastating earthquake in Nepal, a Catholic sister in Louisville, Kentucky, is doing her part to bring clean water to impacted areas.

Ursuline Sister Larraine Lauter, founder of Water With Blessings, sprang into action shortly after seeing footage of the magnitude 7.8 earthquake that struck a mountainous region near the capital city of Kathmandu, April 25, 2015. "In times of emergency, people start thinking you got to have the pros in there. Well, the mother is a pro. She's a survival pro. She's going to make sure her children and children around her drink clean water if it's available, so we target mothers," Lauter said.

June 26 - 28, 2015 - Province Weekend

At our Province Weekend, several Sisters and Associates made a contribution to Water With Blessings. Eight water filters will be sent to the people of Nepal in the name of the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk. With proper care, the system is useable for at least a decade, and can filter a million gallons of water or 500 gallons daily.

Year of Consecrated Life, and to highlight the contributions of the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk's contributions to Our Lady of Grace Parish in staffing the school for 75 years. Ursuline Heritage

Our Ursuline internationality is a treasure. It means that we personally know people in many different countries. It is always amazing to me that the little Company of St. Ursula, founded by St. Angela in 1535, has expanded to forty-three branches of Ursulines today, present on every continent except Antarctica. Maybe someday we'll be there.

Did you know there are 10 different groups of Ursulines in the US?

Marie Madeleine Hachard was one of the fearless band of French Ursulines who crossed the Atlantic on the *Gironde*, arriving in 1727 in New Orleans. The youngest of the 12 nuns was a 20 year old novice. Marie Madeleine wrote long, detailed letters to her father in Rouen while on board ship and after landing in New Orleans.

This painting depicts the landing of the nuns. Marie Madeleine described the ordeals they faced on board ship, as well as life in Louisiana in the early 18th century. The local patriarchal civil authorities didn't know how to relate to a group of women who were not subject to male authority.

The education of women, black and white, slave and free, was the focal point of their ministry. They quickly began a school for the education of girls, ran an orphanage, ministered in the military hospital, and were catechists.

Fast-forward to the 21st century, where the influence of that small group of French Ursulines continues to spark ongoing "French Connections." Ursuline Academy New Orleans continues the 287-year tradition of educating young women to meet the needs of our time. Today both here and in France, Ursulines carry on their legacy and take courage from their witness.

Pastoral Care of Indigenous Peoples in Guyana

The International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples is observed on August 9 each year to promote and protect the <u>rights of the world's indigenous population</u>. This event also

recognizes the achievements and contributions that <u>indigenous people</u> make to improve world issues such as <u>environmental protection</u>.

In Guyana four of our Sisters from the Ranchi Province team up with seven Jesuits to form a valuable presence among the <u>Amerindian communities</u> in Guyana . The Jesuit mission stretches back over a century and today reaches 60 villages.

Scattered across the Pakaraima Mountains and Rupununi savannah, and straddling the border with Brazil, the Wapishana, Macushi and Patamona villages welcome members of the team for the celebration of the sacraments and pastoral formation.

The visits are greatly appreciated as they offer some stability amidst an otherwise rapidly changing and uncertain world. In recent years the small indigenous communities have suffered from increasing fragmentation. Many of their young people leave in search of income, usually to the gold or diamond mines of Guyana, or to the agro-industrial -projects across the border in Brazil.
