The topic will be *St. Marie of the Incarnation the first woman missionary to the New World*. The legacy of her prayer life and missionary activity inspires all who come to know and love Marie. A new English language book on Marie of the Incarnation's life, *A Woman so Close* to us will be introduced to the Sisters.

International Finance Meeting

The International Finance Team had its first annual meeting from September 2017 the 13-15, at Generalate. Brussels. Representatives from each Province/Vice Province made up the newly formed Team. The purpose of the meeting was to develop a set of guidelines or criteria for implementing the *Chapter* Direction Statement on and sharing of planning resources.

Everything belongs to God. We are only stewards. David Nicholls presented the Ursuline Sisters of Tildonk Human and Financial Resources Projections 2017-2032. The 63 page report will help with long range strategic planning and congregational decision making.

A few of the principles that were woven throughout the meeting were that we desire to share our resources to follow the call of our founders to love and take care of one another.

We recognize the need to support the international mission of our Congregation, fully aware of our demographic reality. Basic to our spirit of sharing is the belief that we must strengthen our solidarity with one another.

The proposals, to be studied during the Extended Council, reflect the fruit of the brain storming sessions, sharing and working together. We experienced the richness of our internationality, and the value of understanding and supporting one another in this valuable service to the Provinces and Congregation as a whole. *Ut unum sint* was evident throughout the 3 days. We are grateful for the prayerful support for the success of the meeting.
