Today the world is characterized by a loss of simple civilities. Loss of paradise was not only the

loss of innocence but the loss of the sense of the other being as sister or brother. If only we shared, the world would become a kinder place. Nobody expects us to be superhuman in our approach to life. In fact the kinder we are the more sensitive we become to each other and to the creation.

The International Tertianship (October 15, 2012—May15, 2013)

We left India for Rome with much anxiety, hope and expectations to see new places, to learn about different cultures and to be



enriched by deep experience of Angela and to grow deeper in God's love.

We stayed one day in Rome and the next day we proceeded to Brussels for a few days' experience of European environment. We had

good time with our Sisters in the Generalate. We were enriched with our sisters in Floordam and Scherpenheuvel. These are the two communities where we lived and experienced the lifestyle and the spirituality of our Belgian Sisters.

Belgium being the birth place of our Founder Fr. John Lambertz, we had the opportunity to visit the Tildonk parish church where he



ministered and founded the Congregation. We saw his grave as well. We felt blessed and grateful for the opportunity given to us.

After two weeks of rich experience with our Sisters in Belgian Province we returned to Rome on October 14, 2012. We began our tertianship program on October 15, 2012, The theme of our tertianship was "go out into the deep" (lk.5:1-11)

We were 19 Sisters all together, divided into English and Spanish speaking groups. We enjoyed our togetherness. We experienced and witnessed this oneness in our sharing, daily Eucharist, prayer, and outings. The whole period of seven months has been a time of grace, a journey of faith, prayer, reading, reflection, learning and a time of renewal.



It was a challenging experience to live with the International group of Sisters for seven full months. One month retreat in January 2013 was another unique time for us.

Our Pilgrimages to Brascia / Desenzano / Salo, Varallo (known as new Jerusalem), Assisi, Subiaco (of St. Benedict), Florence, our visit to different Churches in Rome and reflection on the lives of all the saints were the time of inspiration, encouragement, and an invitation to respond to God's call with much courage and daring and to remain faithful to our consecrated life.

We were privileged:

- to begin our Tertianship program in the 'year of faith'.
- To be in Rome at the historical event of the resignation of Pope Benedict XVI from his office and election of new Pope Francis in the life of Roman Catholic Church.
- To be able to visit Belgium in the beginning



of the program and experience the blessing of Fr. John Lambertz at Tildonk and of Sr. Margaret O'Brien and the other members of Congregation Leadership.

 To be visited by Sr. Margret O'Brien towards the end of our program when she attended the UISG (Union of International Superiors General) meeting 2013 in Rome.



UISG Meeting 2013: In May, I traveled to Rome to attend the meeting of the UISG (Union of International Superiors General). It was an extraordinary experience to be amidst eight hundred women from seventy six countries, all leaders of religious congregations and striving to carry out the mission of Jesus Christ, albeit in various ministries and capacities. One could not help but notice that, in general, the older women present were from North America, Europe



and Australia while the younger women came from Asia, Africa and South America.

We were each assigned to a table of our



chosen language. There we met sisters from across the world. We engaged together around the theme of the gathering and the conferences which were presented.

This year the theme of the meeting was "This will not be so among you," taken from Matthew 20:26. The Gospel continues: "No, anyone who wants to be great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be

first among you must be your slave, just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve,

and to give his life as a ransom for many." Verses 27-28. The challenge being set out before us was very clear.



Each day we heard a presentation on this theme, and each day we were challenged to reflect deeply on what it means to be in

leadership today, how we are to interpret religious authority in today's context, the challenges of our vow of obedience, how to live as followers of Jesus Christ and not merely as worshippers of Jesus Christ.

How we have lived our vows in the past is no guarantee that we shall know how to live them in the future. The UISG meeting challenges us to discern together how we are being called now to live religious life, what is the essence of our life and what needs to be discarded.

May we have the courage to face the realities of our day, to engage in the



challenging questions which confront us, and to live into the future with confidence and trust in our loving Creator God.
