


Dear Sisters and Associates.

The theme of General Chapter 2014, "Live Contemplative Spirituality for Mission Today" along with the Logo is calling us back to the Source, to the center of our being. It is calling us to the center and sending us out. unique opportunity to be part of the International gathering of the Ursulines, which was held from 15^{th} June to 20^{th} June 2014 in New York, U.S.A.

- The theme and the purpose: The theme of the International Conference was "Global Education in the Ursuline Spirit."
 This conference was arranged by Roman Union Sisters who are one of the branches

of St. Angela Merici. The Tildonk Ursulines were especially invited for this conference. This was based on St. Angela's spirituality. Every day was unique as we listened to the speakers on different themes i.e. Redeeming administration, the value of a liberal art education, Angela Merici - wise quide on the path of life, Seeking

to extend the kingdom to the ends of the earth with a great and longing heart.

We are happy to know that Ursulines as well as lay people are very familiar with the spirit of Angela Merici and in their education they try to implement her teachings.

We were very much struck to see that the spirituality of St. Angela Merici is globally relevant and meaningful Even though in several even today. countries the vocations of the sisters in the congregation has gone down but the lay people are fully convinced of this valuable spirituality and want to perpetuate it even today. Therefore we were able to speak a common language, have a common dream, share common hopes and aspiration and above all we felt deep sense of unity. We still remember people saying - "The sisters may not be there anymore, but the spirit of Angela will be kept alive by us (lay people).

2. Our participation and involvement: We felt complete acceptance in this International Conference. All 126 participants coming from 26 countries made no difference between where we come from and what is our colour or nationality but were one in mind and heart in the spirit of St. Angela.

us from Gumla Province for
the conference.

In the group sharing there was good understanding and respect for one another.

Sr. Nirmala Lucas had also accepted to moderate one session along with Bernadette Nott from South Africa. After the session people appreciated her role.

3. The learning and the looking forward: Probably this conference was the biggest exposure for each of us. Apart from the main theme there were many other leanings like how to look into the minute details of organizing. The great learning for us was how to make our institutions persons centered, how to manage our institutions while remaining focused on the personal growth of each individual.

The journey itself from Ranchi to New York via Delhi, Bahrain, London, Buffalo, Niagara falls, Michigan, Lansing, Meckinac Island and Chicago were beyond our dreams. There were many Ursulines and friends like Fr. Prabhu, Fr. Dominic Fr. Louise who went out of their way to receive



us in their places introducing us to the life and work of America. We are more convinced of the spirituality and values of St. Angela Merici and the mission that we all do today.

We thank the Lord for keeping us in good health and bringing us safe to our destination. We are grateful to all the sisters for their prayers.

PROVINCE DAY 2014

Ranchi Province, India, celebrated its Province Days 2014 on 5th and 6th June, 2014 at Ursuline Convent, Ranchi Mother House. Altogether about 200 sisters including our novices participated in the program.

On 5th May, at 9.00 A. M. Sr. Eve Justina Romould OSU, our Provincial, warmly welcomed all of them.

The Opening Prayer, with power point presentation on different songs of the Holy Spirit, helped us to be in companionship with the disciples of Jesus waiting for the Holy Spirit, as indeed this week was devoted to the novena for Pentecost.

Sr. Eve, Provincial gave us the following information regarding the membership in Ranchi Province as on June 2014:

Professed sisters - 374 of which Finally Professed are 293 and Juniors 81; Novices 81; Postulants 17, Candidates 18.

41 communities with various apostolates.

She gave us a concise report and update of the Extended Council 2014 held in January 2014 in Pune, Maharashtra, India.

Theme of the General Chapter: "Live Contemplative Spirituality for Mission today".

She shared with us the message given at the Extended Council by Sr. Margaret O'Brien, Congregation Leader.

August 27, 2014 will be day а Thanksgiving by the whole Ranchi province as we join with our sisters in Canada in celebrating the Centenary, to thank God for

the wonderful mission accomplished by them in the past 100 years. Sr. Eve further announced that we are heading towards the Bi-Centenary of the Foundation Day of the Ursuline Congregation of Tildonk in Belgium on 30th April, 2018.

In the second session, Sr. Helen spoke on Spirituality and focused on the Contemplative Spirituality of St. Angela and John Lambertz, our Founders. She said, both our Founders were persons deeply rooted in God. This deep union with God gave them great energy and inner freedom

to do their mission of bringing God to all and vice versa

During the Holy Mass, Rev. Fr. Xavier Soreng, SJ, Ex-Provincial, said that Contemplative Spirituality is understood in terms of a life of prayer action prompted by the Holy Spirit, a disposition which is not limited to devotional practices, rituals or other practices of piety, but it permeates our whole being and unifies all our thinking and acting. In simple words we can understand this as "finding God in all things and all things in God".

- 2. How is the province living the Ursuline charism "Contemplatives in Action"?
- 3. How might Congregational Leadership Team best serve the whole Congregation according to the signs of the times?
- 4. In the light of the Theme of general Chapter 2014, what could be the

theme of our 7th Provincial Chapter 2015?

On the second day, 6th June, the day began with the Eucharistic celebration at 6.30 A. M. presided by Rev. Fr. Michael, from St. Albert's Major Seminary, Ranchi. He invited the assembly saying that Province Days are a time for celebration, our coming together and being together where Jesus is the centre. In his homily based on the Gospel of the day he said, "Absence of Jesus brings emptiness, but when Jesus is present, there is abundance. Contemplative

spirituality means being aware of God's presence". It is reflected in our words and actions.

At 8.30 A.M. opening prayer was led by Sr. Pushpa Kujur, Councillor, on the theme, "I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15: 1-10).

After that Mrs. Barbara Binha, an experienced RNRM nurse and tutor at CIP, Kanke spoke on how to take care of our physical and mental health. She said that our health has various components e.g. physical, social, mental, emotional, and spiritual. Total health is affected when any of the components suffers. She set before us various examples.
